#### Focus on positives

- Don't tell us not to do things, teach us from a positive angle
- We zone out if we feel we are having the same conversation over and over again
- Don't pressure us to tell you things leave a 'window of opportunity'
- We know you want to make us safe but it needs to be in a real context





### Look at different ways of doing things

- Bring other people in to deliver sessions
- Use people that are closer to our age so that we know they have experienced similar things
- We will learn better if we can relate to the language used
